

## NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Exhibits to be staged at Harlow Carr from 1pm on 16<sup>th</sup> October 2016.
2. There are no restrictions regarding pan size.
3. Number of entries per class not restricted; entries are free.
4. No prize monies are given.
5. Plants need not have been grown in pots in which they are exhibited.
6. All plants must be labelled.
7. Pan includes pots which maybe plastic or clay.
8. Bulbous plants are monocots with underground storage organs and include: Albuca, Allium, Cautleya, Colchicum, Cooperia, Galanthus, Habranthus, Hippeastrum, Leucojum, Lilium, Merendera, Moraea, Narcissus, Nerine, Ornithogalum, Rhodophiala, Roscoea, Scilla, Sternbergia, Tigridia, Tulbaghia, Weldenia, Zephyranthes, Zigadenus. It excludes Orchidaceae and dicots eg Corydalis, Cyclamen, Geranium, Oxalis and Ranunculus.
9. In classes for plants not in flower, there may be down pointing if blooms are present.
10. In class 10, fullest information is required. Plants exhibited without botanical notes including: family, genus, species (and where appropriate variety, subspecies or cv.) and country of origin may be disqualified.
11. In class 13 exhibits may be judged for flower, foliage or fruit.
12. Fern includes fern allies eg Selaginella, Lycopodium, Isoetes and Equisetum.
13. Dwarf conifers are those which are naturally dwarf, prostrate species and small cvs. They do not include seedlings or young plants raised from cuttings, layers or grafts which at maturity are large shrubs or trees.
