**Note 1****Hardiness ratings**

H1 (a,b and c) = plants requiring heated glass

H2 = plants requiring cool or frost-free glass

H3 = plants hardy in unheated glass or a mild winter

H4 = plants hardy outside in a UK average winter

H5 = plants hardy outside in a UK severe winter

H6 = hardy, very cold winter, -20 to -15

H7 = very hardy, <-20

A more detailed description of hardiness ratings is available from your Committee Secretary.

**Note 2****Purpose**

Please indicate under which category the exhibit should be judged. A plant judged as an exhibition flower can receive the following awards:

- Certificate of Preliminary Commendation
- Award of Merit
- First Class Certificate

A plant judged on its value for garden decoration can be recommended for further assessment for the Award of Garden Merit.

A plant may be judged in both categories.

**Note 3****Number of specimens required**

At least one plant in a pot or pan, or sufficient cut material to show the character of the plant.

NB For all daffodils and tulips the following requirements apply:

For a Certificate of Preliminary Commendation: not fewer than three stems, either cut or in one or more pot, pan or bowl.

For an Award of Merit or for further assessment as a candidate for the Award of Garden Merit: not fewer than five stems, either cut or in one or more pot, pan or bowl.

For a First Class Certificate: not fewer than ten stems, either cut or in one or more pot, pan or bowl.

**General Note**

All exhibitors should be familiar with the general regulations for submitting plants for awards and with any particular requirements relating to this Committee. This information may be obtained from the Committee Secretary.

It should be noted that, when appropriate, a specimen will be taken for preservation in the horticultural herbarium at Wisley.
