Registered charity No. 207478 © Alpine Garden Society 2023 Martin Hajman gave two talks on alpine plant collections at Tromsø Botanical Garden; we were all in awe of the rare and beautiful things that thrive in what is the world's northernmost botanical garden.

AGS Trustee Tom Freeth talked about alpines in Colorado and about rock gardens in Colorado and Utah. Over in the States, there are several landscapers that create real works of art using native species set in naturalistic rockeries.

Rogier van Vugt, the Head of Horticulture at Leiden Botanical Garden in the Netherlands, took us on a tour on the edges of Europe in search of rare orchids. He finished his talk by giving advice on how to grow hardy orchids based on his experience managing one of the largest collections of hardy orchids in Europe.

David Charlton took us on a trip around the mountains of New Zealand and then to Svalbard in search of cushion plants. Julian Sutton brought the Conference to an end with his talk on how flowers evolved. The audience was also entertained by Robert Potterton

The AGS Seed Exchange went live on 13 November 2023 Seed orders are currently being accepted.

Key Dates for this year's Seed Exchange

December – January (with a 2 week Christmas break): seed orders will be picked

Late December – January: seed orders will be posted. Although we hope to be able to start posting out orders before Christmas, the majority of orders will be posted out in January.

8 January: Last date for Main Orders

15 January: Last date for Surplus Orders

Seed Exchange for overseas members 2023

Seed Ordering

We are very sorry that due to high costs of obtaining phytosanitary certificates in England, we are unable to send seed to Japan, Australia and the EU. For all other overseas members there is no change from previous years and you will be able to order seed this year in the same way as you have done in the past. We can send seed to Northern Ireland and Norway.

USA

Members from the USA who wish to order seed must send in an import permit by post, or email it to Diane Clement using the email address below. You must send your import permit and one green/yellow label for every 50 packets or fewer that you order.

Please include your email address on your order in case we need to get in touch with you. If you already have a permit, please check it is still valid until at least March 2024 to allow time for postage of your seed order and administrative work by the USDA. Permits are free and will be valid for 3 years. Details about the permit can be found at:

https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/resources/permits/sa_plants/ppq-epermits then select PPQ 587 Application for permit to import plants or plant products.

You do not have to use the inspection station which is nearest to your home and at the current time we suggest that you do not use Los Angeles, Miami or New York as these are the busiest ports and can lead to delay in receiving your seed. Alternative designated ports of entry can be found on the site.




CROATIA & HERZEGOVINA
