It's always good to plan visits well in advance but when you plan for one so early in the year, eight months in advance, it pays to have a little bit of luck on your side and so it was on Sunday 3rd February, when we visited the garden of Margo Grice. We had to plan around several Galanthophile meetings (Margo's first love), so we had to pick a day which was potentially a little early in the year. Since the turn of the year, we had heard that the garden had already been underwater three times - not just heavy rain but literally underwater, from the stream that runs around two sides of Margo's property breaching its banks, all the way up to the patio steps, along with some Icy-blasts and gale-force winds in the preceding weeks, so only time would tell. This is where the luck came in: the weather was kind, the sun popped it's head out from behind the clouds every now and then but most importantly, the season was running about 10 days early, so the garden was at its peak when we arrived. Around 20 people made the journey to 'Dragons' where they were fed and watered not only on cake and tea but on a feast of so many Snowdrops that to see every named cultivar and species alone would have taken hours. Not only Snowdrops but early flowering Crocus, Iris, Cyclamen, Eranthis and Hellebores brought colour to the vibrant white ground cover amonast the manicured lawns. I was particularly taken by a plant of Yucca rostrata 'Sapphire Skies', which takes pride of place on the Patio. Scant evidence of the flooding remained after Margo had washed the mud from, what seemed like each individual leaf, for us to enjoy. Margo also had some plants for sale, which made a tidy sum for her chosen charity (and made for some very happy members). As a small token of our appreciation, the group made a presentation to Margo to thank her for allowing us to enjoy her magnificent garden.
